In the Field

Planting our rotations and fill areas was wrapped up in June, and plots have been maintained and monitored through the early portion of the growing season. Notetaking has begun for emergence, heading, and general observations. Additionally, our pathology team has been hard at work inoculating and irrigating our disease nurseries at CDC North and in Lacombe!

Crossing

Crossing season is upon us! The variety development pipeline begins with parent crossing, which is performed meticulously by hand. This makes it an exciting but laborious time of year







for WCI. This year, we are producing 126 crosses for barley and 85 for triticale in our endeavour to develop new, winning varieties! Crossing began in the first week of July, and was completed July 16.
